

2023 NSA Student Research Awards

The Association has a number of competitive grants for students that provide \$1250 in support student research projects as well as for the Outstanding Student Paper published in the *JSR*.



The **George R. Abbe Award** for student research devoted to the areas of crustacean biology and fisheries management was awarded to Gregory Rothman, University of Charleston, for his proposal "Investigating non-native crayfish, *Procambarus clarkii*, as a potential vector of white spot disease to native

crustaceans in South Carolina, USA".

The Melbourne R. Carriker Award for student research in any area of shellfisheries was awarded to Anna Poslednik, Virginia Institute of Marine Sciences, for her proposal "Genetic perspective on the phenotypic evolution of the marine parasite *Perkinsus marinus*".





The Michael Castagna Award for student research devoted to the area of applied shellfisheries was awarded to Alexandra Mitchell, University of Charleston, for her proposal "Understanding reproductive development in female white shrimp, *Penaeus setiferus*, in support of sustainable fisheries

management".

The inaugural R. LeRoy Creswell Award for Outreach and Education Award for students who have shown exceptional merit in outreach activities was awarded to Kayla Mladinich Poole, University of Connecticut, for her outreach efforts regarding her dissertation research "Selective ingestion of microplastics by suspension feeding invertebrates: investigations



suspension-feeding invertebrates: investigations into sources, fate, and concentrations in coastal environments".

The Sandra E. Shumway Award for Outstanding Student Paper published in the *Journal of Shellfish Research* has specific selection and evaluation criteria: (1) The lead author must have been a student when the work was completed, (2) the paper must present the student's work, not that of a coauthor, (3) it will be evaluated on the quality of science and writing, and (4) the importance of the work to the field of shellfish research. A panel of judges evaluated 23 papers, and the award was presented to Samara French for her manuscript:
